The application must be signed by one of the following: Licensee as an individual; or all members of the partnership; or the principal director/shareholder of the licensee company; or licensees' Solicitor. NOT an Agent.

The notice must be published twice in either The Dominion Post or The Wellingtonian, with not less than 5 days and not more than 10 days between the 2 dates of publication.
3. Within 10 working days after filing this application with the District Licensing Agency, the applicant must ensure that the notice – Display on Premises is attached in a conspicuous place on or adjacent to the site to which the application relates (unless the Secretary of the District Licensing Agency agrees that it is impracticable or unreasonable to do so).
