- Allow as much time as possible prior to the date of an event to obtain all appropriate consents. Applications must be filed with the DLA six weeks prior to the date of the event(s).
- A building consent may be required prior to the issue of a Special Licence if you are intending to use a building that is not normally used as a licensed premises and/or a marquee or tent is required. This process may take up to 10 working days. For more information about obtaining a building consent, Ph (03) 305 00 33.
- The building owner has an obligation under the current Building Act to ensure that the building is safe and fit for its intended purpose. Please provide confirmation from the building owner that the building is appropriate for this type of function.
- Please note that no more than 12 events or dates can be applied for on this application form.

- a written statement from the owner of the building giving consent to the applicant for liquor to be sold or supplied on the premise and confirmation that the building is appropriate for the type of function being applied for.
- a complete list of all food, non alcohol and low alcohol beverages that are to be provided.
- a copy of each manager's certificate for those nominated to manage the event (if applicable)
- if the event is on a "Statutory Day" has the DLA/Police criteria been addressed?
 - If a private event:**
 - a copy of the invitation
 - a list of all invited guests (full names)
 - If a public event:**
 - a copy of the ticket
 - a copy of any promotional material for the event

Please note that the applicant must be the party that will be taking the money from the business e.g. the name on the bank account. The application must be signed by one of the following: Applicant if an individual; or all members of the partnership; or the principal director/shareholder of the company; or applicant's Solicitor NOT an Agent.
