

Chatham Islands Gorse control initiative 2025-26

Background Information

The purpose of this initiative is to support land occupiers on the Chatham Islands territory to maintain and control gorse on their property.

Gorse continues to be a major pest on the island and impacts on both the economic productivity of local farming operations and the environment.

This control initiative is for **herbicide only** to a total value of approximately \$30,000. The herbicide is available to all landowners and lessees of land on the Chatham Islands who can provide evidence of planned control activities and current Certified Handler Compliance Certification (e.g. Growsafe).

Because the funding this year is herbicide only, it will be up to the landowner/lessee to pay for a contractor or apply the herbicide themselves.

The Herbicide available is as follows:

- Tordon Brushkiller XT
- Slikka super penetrant

Guidelines

Who can apply?

The gorse control initiative is open only to residents of the Chatham Islands with Certified Handlers Certification who have gorse on their land and are committed to undertaking control to manage this pest. The Fund is not available for work on public land.

How to Apply

To be considered all applications must:

- Have completed this application form to an acceptable standard
- Be accompanied by a map showing property boundaries and gorse distribution, where herbicide is to be applied
- Include photos of the areas
- Focus of control must be on boundary and scattered plants initially, control of block areas may be considered once boundary and scattered has been undertaken.
- Provide evidence of Certified Handlers Certification that can be photographed and that there is up to date PPE that will be used during spraying.

PROPERTIES MAY REQUIRE A PROPERTY CHECK prior to being considered for herbicide. These would need to be completed by Environment Canterbury Biosecurity staff. Staff will contact you to arrange a suitable time for a visit if required.

- The visit is to look at the areas to be considered for control
- This visit may also look at areas that have been controlled previously.

Terms and conditions

1. Herbicide will be allocated on a case-by-case basis.
2. Approval of herbicide allocation may be subject to conditions.
3. All decisions will be final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
4. If successful in obtaining herbicide, the control work is expected to be completed by **30 April 2026**
5. Herbicide will only be released to a person with a **current** Certified Handlers Certificate (e.g. GrowSafe). Evidence of this will be required.
6. The fund recipients will be required to advise Biosecurity staff on the completion of the work and allow access to the property to confirm work has occurred or provide evidence/report that the work has been done.
7. The applicant will undertake due diligence regarding the Chatham Islands Resource Management Document, in particular Table 5.3.4 Rules - Rural Zone and will decide if a resource consent is required. (link to document is below)

Tordon label usage rates:

GORSE:

Ground application: During the active growth period from spring until early summer apply **TORDON BRUSHKILLER XT** at 250ml/100 litres. During periods of slow growth or when gorse is dormant or stressed e.g. in hot, dry, dusty, frosty or salty conditions or when plants have been slashed or grazed, the addition of Boost™ Penetrant to the spraymix at 100ml/100 litres is recommended. In North Canterbury use **TORDON BRUSHKILLER XT** at 300ml/100L plus Boost Penetrant at 100ml/100 litres spraymix. Follow up treatment may be necessary to obtain complete control.

Evidence of Certified/Approved Handler Certification

Application of Tordon Brushkiller requires Approved Handler Certification as stipulated on the herbicide label and in accordance with the Hazardous Substances and New Organisms Act 1996 as follows:

3.1D, 6.1D, 6.3B, 6.4A, 6.5B, 6.9B, 9.1A, 9.2A, 9.3C

APPROVED HANDLER

This product must be under the personal control of an approved handler when:

- a) applied in a wide dispersive manner; or
- b) used by a commercial contractor.

RECORD KEEPING

Records of use, as described in the relevant HSNO regulations and the New Zealand Standard for the Management of Agrichemicals (NZS8409), must be kept if more than 3L of **TORDON BRUSHKILLER XT** is applied, or discharged within 24 hours in a place where members of the public may be present or where the substance may enter air or water and leave the place.
